News from the Society of St. Vincent de Paul

During the month of September we celebrate the feast days of our founder, Blessed Frederic Ozanam, and our patron saint, St. Vincent de Paul.

In 1831, Frederic Ozanam, born in Italy and educated in France, was challenged about his Catholic faith. While attending the University in Paris he organized a group of students to debate the issues of the day. At that time, there was a lot of hostility toward Christianity, and in particular, Catholicism. It was during one of these debates that Frederic was asked about what works he performed to prove his faith. He took that rebuke to heart, and began his mission to serve the poor in his community. In 1833 Frederic and several friends established the Conference of Charity and the Society of St. Vincent de Paul. Their mission was to serve the poor, promote human dignity and integrity and address social justice issues in the Church and society. Through his dedication and leadership, the Society of St. Vincent de Paul spread throughout Europe, resulting in 2500 conferences and over 50,000 members by 1860. Blessed Frederic Ozanam, who passed away in September, 1853, was beatified in 1997. His liturgical feast day is September 8.

St. Vincent de Paul, born and educated in France, was ordained a Catholic priest in 1600. He soon began serving the poor and suffering in small towns throughout France. He founded the Confraternities of Charity in 1617, an organization of lay women that continued his mission of caring for the poor and sick. Then in 1625 he founded the Congregation of the Mission, a community of priests who evangelized in poor and rural areas. The Daughters of Charity, co-founded by Vincent de Paul and Louise de Marillac in 1633, provided health, education and social ministries to the poor. Vincent de Paul passed away in 1660. He was canonized in 1737, and his feast day is celebrated on September 27.

Today, all three organizations established by St. Vincent de Paul are active throughout the world. The Society of St. Vincent de Paul also continues to grow internationally.
