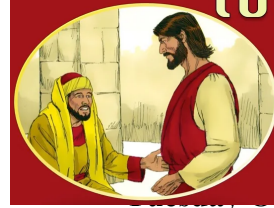
For a few weeks there will be times when the previously scheduled multiple intentions will be celebrated, but hopefully by the first of 2022, we will be in full compliance.

Eucharistic Ministers to the Homebound

The procedures for taking the Eucharist to the homebound have changed. Instead of getting the host in the communion procession, ***you are now asked to come forward at the conclusion of Mass and Father Miller, Deacon Nick, or Nick Perkoski will go to the tabernacle and place the host(s) in your pyx.*** If you need a pyx, we have extras in the sacristy. As a reminder, when you leave the church, you should go directly to the homebound person(s) and distribute communion.
