Nine Days of Prayer, Penance and Pilgrimage

In January our nation remembers the infamous 1973 Supreme Court decisions Roe v. Wade and Doe v. Bolton. Since then more than 60 million children's lives have been lost to abortion, while the lives of their parents have been shattered. Each year the United States Conference of Catholic Bishops call for "*Nine Days of Prayer, Penance and Pilgrimage*" taking place this year from January 21 until 29. FMI visit www.9daysforlife.com.

The March begins at Assumption Church on Rt. 20 (W. Main and Lockwood Sts. in Geneva. Weather permitting, marchers will assemble at Noon in the rear parking lot and proceed ½ mile to the Rotary Pavilion next to the Geneva Community Center on Rt. 20. For those unable to march there is public parking behind the pavilion.
